Admissions Frequently Asked Questions

What steps are involved with the Admissions Process?

- Using our website at hcasaints.org, the following are the steps for Admission:
- Schedule an in-person tour or visit our online virtual tour.
 - We currently offer open houses in our new Keller location as well as in-person tours in our current location. (Main Campus moving to Keller starting July 1)
 - Virtual Tours will be available soon.
- "Become a Saint for a Day" which allows your student to shadow classes and meet future classmates!
- Apply at hcasaints.org (an application fee is required).
- Provide requested documentation such as report cards, transcripts, immunizations, and recommendations.
- Meet with the Headmaster.
- Once accepted, you will receive an email inviting you to enroll.

How are Admissions decisions rendered?

There are many factors considered in the admissions process. Testing does play a role in determining the probability of your student's success at HCA. Other considerations are teacher recommendations, church leader recommendations, grades, past standardized testing and the outcome of the family interview. Because HCA is an academically challenging, discipleship-focused school, we want to ensure that students and their families are a good fit in all areas.

Does my child have to be tested for admission?

All applicants are tested prior to admission unless they have taken a nationally standardized test within the past year and can provide their scores. Testing fees are identified as part of the admissions checklist.

When can my child apply and enroll?

Availability is determined on a class-by-class basis and can change. We accept applications throughout the year. Please contact the HCA Admissions Office at 817-485-1660 or <u>admissions@hcasaints.org</u> to determine current availability.

Does HCA offer financial aid?
