


Fall sports have officially come to an end, but everyone is still buzzing over the Lady Saints volleyball team. They finished the 2021 season as area champions, led by Coach Jeff Wilhelm and captains, Landry Kate Fowler, Morgan Cobb, and Ashlyn Beck. In 2018, the Lady Saints finished with one district win and nine losses. The next season, they finished as bi-district champions and matched that title in 2020. After two consecutive bi-district wins, this year's team was unsatisfied. They secured second place in district, only behind Midland Christian, last year's state champions. The Lady Saints began playoffs with a three-set win against Lucas Christian, but they did not stop there. Their next opponent was Denton Calvary Academy, and Lady Saints defeated the Lions in a blowout three-set win, making the Saints area champions. Though their playoff run ended on Saturday, November 13th with a loss to Dallas Lutheran, their season was beyond successful. They are now the first team in Harvest history to win a tournament, finish as area champions, and compete as one of the final eight teams! HCA so proud of their Lady Saints volleyball team!

What are some family traditions or activities you enjoy during Thanksgiving?


